Inter-institutional¹ agreement 2020-2023² between institutions from

Programme and Partner Countries³ (Key Action 107)

Reference

The Erasmus+ Project Grant Agreement (No. 2020-1-DE01-KA107-005433) comprises funding for the mobility of students and staff that can be undertaken from 1 August 2020 to 31 July 2023.

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits or equivalent to students and staff by partner institutions. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of the project and of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

Objective

Erasmus+ aims to improve higher education and provides funding opportunities for cooperation/mobility between European countries and partner countries throughout the world. It aims further to help individual learners acquiring skills, to support their professional development and to deepen their understanding of other cultures. It shall help to increase the capacities, attractiveness and international dimension of the organisations taking part.

Additional Requirements:

Due to limited project funds, only a certain duration of stay can be financed by Erasmus+. The actual academic stay of each participant may exceed this duration. In this case, additional funding by the participant needs to be provided summing up to the monthly allowance necessary for issuing a visa in the host country and ensuring sufficient living costs.

For enrolment, the relevant department for which the student applies governs the special admission requirements. To stipulate the study programme, a **Learning Agreement** is part of the student's application. The Learning Agreement will be provided by RUB and will be sent to the students before their stay at RUB to complete.

As the EU COMM grants the partners a certain flexibility within the limits of the institutional grant, the direction of mobility as well as the number of persons may be subject to change throughout the 36-months project period. Any change to this agreement, however, requires written consent of both parties. Amendments via e-mail will be sufficient.

Additional Requirements:

Due to limited project funds, only a certain duration of stay can be financed by Erasmus+. The actual stay of each participant may exceed this duration. In this case, additional funding by the participant needs to be provided summing up to the allowance necessary for issuing a visa in the host country and ensuring sufficient living costs. For an invitation, the relevant department at the host institution and the guest staff member need to agree with the work plan for the stay within an individual **Mobility Agreement.** The Mobility Agreement will be provided by RUB and will be sent to programme participants before their stay to complete. As the EU COMM grants the partners a certain flexibility within the limits of the institutional grant, the direction of mobility as well as the number of persons may be subject to change throughout the 36-months project period. Any change to this agreement, however, requires written consent of both parties. Amendments via e-mail will be sufficient.

UZBEKISTAN STATE UNIVERSITY OF WORLD LANGUAGES agrees to:

- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal
 opportunities to participants eligible for mobility. That means that information on the
 application and selection procedures including application and selection criteria, list
 of applicants and selected programme participants will be documented and sent to
 RUB.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of mobility of its programme participants.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions, the use of miscellaneous material, and services and contributions.
- Inform all participants transparently about fees and cost of living.

UZBEKISTAN STATE UNIVERSITY OF WORLD LANGUAGES located in a **Partner Country** of Erasmus+ further undertakes to:

Before mobility

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency as stated under Part C.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, if required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. See the information/visa section below for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, if required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. The institution from the Partner Country should inform mobile participants of cases in which accident and liability insurance cover is not automatically provided. Mobile participants must





ensure and provide sufficient insurance, such as health and travel insurance and liability, and must cover costs individually.

• Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation. See the information/housing section below for contact details.

During and after mobility

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and incoming mobile participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the institution's everyday life, and have in place appropriate mentoring and support arrangements and services for mobile participants as well as appropriate linguistic support to incoming mobile participants.
- Accept all educational activities indicated in the Learning Agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at resp. after the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 5 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement:

This agreement is valid retrospectively for the granted project duration from 01 August 2020 until 31 July 2023 from the date that it is signed by both parties. For the continuation of the Erasmus+ cooperation, both parties shall evaluate the project results on a regular basis to support another application for funding under the Erasmus+ Programme KA107.

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchange notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX +1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
